12/02/YYYY: Visited Emergency department after MVA via ambulance – CT of abdomen showed Mild subsegmental atelectasis bilaterally - Minimal left upper anterior chest subcutaneous bruising - Hepatomegaly and steatosis - Prior hysterectomy and cholecystectomy – CT of cervical spine showed Degenerative Joint Disease – X-ray of chest, pelvis, CT of head, right knee, and right tibia showed normal - Diagnosed acute cervical strain and multiple contusions of right hip, right knee, and right lower leg – Prescribed Hydrocodone/ASAP 5 mg/325 mg, Naproxen 500 mg, and Flexeril 10 mg.

04/18/YYYY: MRI of lumbar spine without contrast - Mild to moderate multilevel spondylosis. MRI of cervical spine showed Mild to moderate multilevel spondylosis - C5-6, moderate left paracentral disc herniation and degenerative spurring - Moderate left lateral recess stenosis and moderate left foraminal stenosis - C6-7, moderate central and to a lesser extent paracentral disc bulge and spur, consequent mild to moderate foraminal stenosis and moderate central canal stenosis.
